North Country Trail Maintenance

This summer volunteers from the Fish and Game Club maintained two and a half miles of the North Country National Scenic Trail. The trail, which is still under construction, will eventually extend 4,600 miles from New York to North Dakota, making it the longest hiking trail in the United States. So far 2,600 miles have been completed.

The club's adopted section of trail runs from US 45 at the O-Kun-De-Kun Falls trail head east to Forest Service Road 733 on the Ottawa National Forest. Prior to the club's adopting the trail, it had been maintained by members Sherry and Tony Zoar.

"Our hats go off to Tony and Sherry for maintaining this trail," said Steve Kickert, one of the volunteers. "It's a tough section of trail with lots of brush and tall grass to cut through."

Work included cutting grass and shrubs that covered the trail and widening the tread to make it easier to maintain in the future.



Treasurer's Report

The Board has approved a budget that provides for \$3,080 to be spent during the 2015-2016 fiscal year that began July 1, 2015. This is \$420 less than what was budgeted to be spent during the 2014-2015 fiscal year. The majority of the Club's operating expenses for the 2015-2016 fiscal year will be for general membership meetings, administrative expenses, publicity, maintenance and fuel for the groomer for the cross country ski trail, the community photo contest, and membership in 3 organizations.

The Board has also approved the use of funds from the groomer maintenance reserve fund. Those funds will be used for upgrading the groomer equipment and installing a winch.

As of September 18th, membership dues totaling \$1,315 have been paid. This is \$920 less than what had been received as of September 5, 2014. Thanks to those members who have renewed or new members that have joined, we are 50 % on the way towards meeting the goal for revenue from membership dues. If you have not paid your membership dues, please take time to do so. A membership form is included with this newsletter for your use in remitting your dues to Mary Thomas.

2015-16 Membership Renewals

It's still membership renewal time! A membership runs from July 1st to June 30th of the following year. The dues are \$10 per person, \$20 per family or \$15 for a business membership.

Also consider donating to our long standing Educational Endowment Fund which gives grants to teachers in the Northland Pines, Phelps, and Watersmeet School Districts for classroom educational programs as well as scholarships to graduating seniors continuing their education in programs related to the environment. For those unfamiliar with this section of the bike trail, the surface consists of crushed and packed fine gravel, suitable for most bikes except for those road bikes with very narrow tires. The southern portion of the trail is relatively flat, but riders encounter numerous hills as they progress north of the area around Allen Lake.

Over twenty club members and guests met at the Michigan highway wayside located on US 45 just north of County Hwy B to enjoy a beautiful ride through gently rolling terrain. Time permitting we will leave the Treaty Tree and drive to the George Young Recreation complex where we will hike the 1.5 mile Wolf Track Nature Trail before returning home.
